

## Teacher / Librarian Discussion Guide

### The Amazing Julius: The Creek of Captain Drizzlebeard

**Purpose:** These discussion questions are designed to encourage critical thinking, reading comprehension, character analysis, personal reflection, and exploration of the themes and morals found within the story. The suggested answers are not intended to be the only correct responses. Students should be encouraged to support their ideas with examples from the story.

#### **1. What was your favorite part of Julius's adventure, and why did that part stand out to you?**

Possible Discussion Points:

- Students may enjoy the pirate ship appearing on the flooded creek.
- Students may enjoy the rescue during the Whirlpool of Doom.
- Students may enjoy the humorous biscuit negotiations.
- Students may identify with Julius using his imagination to create Villagerton.
- Encourage students to explain why the scene was exciting, funny, surprising, or meaningful.

#### **2. If you had been with Julius during this adventure, what would you have done differently, and why?**

Possible Discussion Points:

- Students may suggest bringing additional supplies.
- Students may have tried talking to the pirates sooner.
- Students may have built a larger fort.
- Students may have helped the pirates navigate the creek.
- There are no wrong answers if students can explain their reasoning.

#### **3. What character traits did Julius show during this adventure, and which of those traits do you think are important in real life?**

Possible Discussion Points:

- Courage – Julius confronted an unknown situation.
- Leadership – Julius organized the challenge and guided the pirates.
- Compassion – Julius rescued the pirates when they were in danger.
- Creativity – Julius transformed ordinary surroundings into an adventure.
- Responsibility – Julius felt responsible for protecting Villagerton.
- Students should discuss which traits are important and how they apply to everyday life.

#### **4. When Julius first saw the pirate ship coming down the flooded creek, he immediately decided to defend Villagerton. Why do you think Julius felt responsible for protecting the village, even though it existed only in his imagination?**

Possible Discussion Points:

- Julius takes his adventures seriously.
- He sees himself as a protector and leader.
- His imagination makes the village feel real and worth defending.
- He cares about helping others, even imaginary people.
- Discussion can explore how imagination allows people to practice responsibility, empathy, and leadership.

**5. After this adventure, what lessons do you think Julius learned, and what parts of the story make you believe that?**

Possible Discussion Points:

- Not everyone who seems different or threatening is actually an enemy.
- Working together can solve problems better than fighting.
- Helping others is often more important than winning.
- Good leaders listen, adapt, and care for others.
- Imagination can be a powerful tool for creativity and problem-solving.
- Students should be encouraged to cite specific moments from the story that support their conclusions.
